IIA Singapore - AiSP Evening Talk:

Keeping your data secure for your day to day business

SINGAPORE. The inaugural run of the Cybersecurity Advisory & Awareness Programme (CAAP) curriculum has kicked off with a workshop attended by more than 80 participants from the Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA) and selected SMEs. CAAP is organised by the Association of Information Security Professionals (AiSP) and supported by the Cyber Security Agency of Singapore (CSA).

AiSP President, Dr Steven Wong said: “SMEs are an essential and critical part of the supply chain and their cybersecurity posture could greatly impact business operations. Thus, the Cybersecurity Awareness & Advisory Programme aims to provide them with greater awareness and resources to help them bolster their cybersecurity defences.”

Prior to the workshop, AiSP organised two Cybersecurity Awareness & Advisory Focus Group Discussions with the Law Society of Singapore and the Association of Early Childhood & Training Services to discuss how SMEs & the cybersecurity community can work together to create value cybersecurity services for SMEs.

Cybersecurity has always been important. But an increasing trend of large-scale attacks in recent years has resulted in increased urgency to enhance cyber resilience. These incidents show that no organisation is spared from cyber-attacks. Digital transformation initiatives for businesses today thus makes formulating an IT security plan much less simple than it used to be a few years before.

Many businesses process large amounts of confidential customer and/or employee data daily. Our experts in the workshop will help SMEs learn how to improve their cyber defences and reduce business risks.
