Throughout the past 9 months, I am glad to see how the cybersecurity ecosystem have grown even through this pandemic as we bring our talks online to webinar and with the mindset of contributing back to the ecosystem and helping others. Our EXCO and volunteers together with the secretariat team had fostered a very cohesive cybersecurity community in Singapore. This is not common in most countries and is an important asset that we have, and we had to treasure and safeguard. One example was that the Multi Associations had come together to not only organise the Cybersecurity Awards but also organised the first Singapore Cyber Day last year November as they believe cybersecurity vocation is a calling and wants to bring this message closer to Singapore's future generations. They reached out to Singapore Primary, Secondary Schools and Pre-Universities to talk about cybersecurity profession and how everyone is part of Singapore's cybersecurity ecosystem and our cyber resilience. For its first Singapore Cyber Day, the

different associations volunteers are involved in a series of school talks for secondary school and pre-university students where it reached out to more than 1,000 students through the video series. We should all continue to work together and encourage more to volunteer.

- 13.As the President of AiSP, while it is tough to juggle time between work, family and community, it is fruitful and satisfying experience to see the difference made with AISP's initiatives spanning from our advancing the professionals' knowledge under our Cyber Security Body of Knowledge related activities to strengthening the ecosystem through our collaborative partnerships with local, regional and international organisations as well as Cyber Security Awareness and Advisory Programme for SME's in partnership with the Trade and Business Associations. Our outreach to engage, mentor as well as to recognize the younger generation is led by our Ladies-in-Cyber and Student Volunteer and Recognition Programs.
