This year, we received the highest number of nominations compared to previous years where we have 235 student nominations contributing to more than 16,000 volunteer hours to the cybersecurity community. 49 students were awarded the Bronze Award, 36 Students were awarded the Silver Award, 9 Students were awarded the Gold Award and 2 Certificate of Merit for our junior college students. It was heart-warming to see this increase in number of student volunteers who had spent time outside of

their curriculum to learn and give back to the cyber security space. Many of them whom I had interviewed were repeated participants where each year they expanded their volunteer scope in cyber security awareness not just to their peers but also to the people in need like the elderly, youths and SME.
