

#### AiSP and TTAB Launches Inaugural AiSP Cloud Security Summit 2022

**Singapore, 26 September 2022** – Association of Information Security Professionals (AiSP) and Tech Talent AssemBly (TTAB), an affiliate of the National Trades Union Congress (NTUC), have jointly organised the Inaugural Cloud Security Summit 2022 as part of the AiSP Cloud Security Special Interest Group under the theme of "Accelerate your cloud security Journey" at the Suntec Convention Centre.

The event was graced by Guest-of-Honour, Mr Tan Kiat How, Senior Minister of State (SMS) for Communications and Information and National Development and Advisor to NTUC TTAB. More than 200 guests from the industry, public sector and overseas information security associations were in attendance.

Organisations in Singapore and around the world have adopted cloud computing as a key enabler of their digital transformation journey which was accelerated due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Cloud computing offers various attractive benefits to organisations from information technology (IT) maintenance cost reduction, system scalability and innovation enabling capabilities. However, cloud computing also introduces cybersecurity and compliance challenges that needs to be addressed. With many high-profile breaches and leaks of sensitive data related to insecure cloud setup reported in recent months, companies have been forced to re-evaluate their cloud readiness, architecture and security. Opened to anyone with an interest to find out more about the Cloud Security landscape, the event aims to focus on Cloud Security Awareness for the end-user, implementer and service provider.

At the event, SMS Tan Kiat How also presented an award to the winner of the Punggol Digital District: Connecting Smartness Bug Bounty 2.0. Earlier in August 2022, the Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT) collaborated with JTC, Cyber Security Agency of Singapore (CSA), AiSP, and Group-IB, to launch the Punggol Digital District: Connecting Smartness Bug Bounty 2.0. The event was conducted on a subset of Smart Campus technologies that are test-bedded in the Singapore Institute of Technology Living Lab at the SIT@NYP campus and participants took part in the bounty hunting remotely with VPN access. The event's objective was to allow students and professionals in Singapore to put their ethical hacking knowledge and skills to test in the real world environment. Following the success of this Bug Bounty programme



locally, AiSP will partner SIT again to organise the bug bounty for regional participants next year.

AiSP Vice-President and Cloud Security Special Interest Group Lead, Mr Tony Low shared, "We hoped to foster stronger collaboration within the professional security & push stronger awareness in cloud security programme with a security jam week and develop our AiSP Body of Knowledge on basic Cloud Security fundamentals in 2023. Our Special Interest members have intermediate knowledge and application of Cloud Security in their current work to build Cloud Security Standards and Guidelines. AiSP will be collaborating with other Trade Associations & Chambers (TACs) in 2023 to organize joint events together and we hoped that through these events, more people can step out and join us to build a resilient and trusted cyber environment for Singapore."

TTAB President, Mr Ng Tiong Gee said, "We are happy to partner AiSP in building a network of professionals and learners in the area of cloud security, an important area for many organisations' cyber security. In this new age of technology and innovation, our tech talents need to have a mix of highly transferable capabilities to stay relevant, be in demand and enhance their employability in this tight labour market. We also need to nurture and facilitate learning for our next generation of tech talents as technology will continue to evolve. By tapping on the resources and expertise of both associations, our TTAB members will ultimately benefit from this arrangement."
