

Media Release: AiSP Partners with the UK Cyber Security Experts to Harmonise Body of Knowledge Frameworks

Association of Information Security Professionals (AiSP) is excited to announce a new international collaboration with UK cyber security experts to harmonise our respective body of knowledge frameworks for cyber security education and professional training.

The project, "Cyber Security in Singapore and the UK: Exploring the Synergies between the Existing Bodies of Knowledge", brings together experts from CyBOK (Cyber Security Body of Knowledge) led by the University of Bristol, and IS-BOK (Information Security Body of Knowledge), a professional framework developed in Singapore by AiSP. Funded by the UK's Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO), Department for Science, Innovation and Technology (DSIT) and Cyber Security Agency of Singapore (CSA), the initiative explores how these frameworks can complement each other to support global professionalisation and mobility of cyber security professionals.

Initial findings will be shared at Singapore International Cyber Week 2025 on 22 October during the workforce development panel session from 3pm to 5pm at Sands Convention Centre, Level 3 Cassia Ballroom where representatives from the UK-SG project team will share initial findings and outline the project's vision for a more interconnected and agile cyber security ecosystem.

This collaboration reflects AiSP's continued commitment to strengthening the cyber security ecosystem, fostering knowledge exchange, and building a globally connected community of professionals equipped to meet evolving digital threats.

This international collaboration is led by Dr Yulia Cherdantseva, Reader in Cyber Security at Cardiff University and a member of the CyBOK Executive Board since 2021. Dr Cherdantseva is responsible for CyBOK's international strategy and leads the comparative work between CyBOK and the IS-BOK.

Professor Awais Rashid, Principal Investigator of CyBOK and Professor of Cyber Security at the University of Bristol, provides strategic oversight of the initiative.

On the part of AiSP IS-BOK, the project is led by Professor Steven Wong, Professor at the Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT) with Dr Goh Weihan, Associate Professor at the Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT).
