

Student Volunteer Recognition Programme 2022 Awards Ceremony Number of nominations reached a new record of 235

The fourth edition of Student Volunteer & Recognition Programme (SVRP) Awards Ceremony was held on 16 November 2022 at the Ho Bee Auditorium, SIT@Dover to recognise the contributions of student volunteers to the cybersecurity community. This year, a total of 9 Gold, 36 Silver and 49 Bronze awards were given out to student volunteers who have demonstrated exemplary record of hours in volunteering for cybersecurity. Recognising their passion, dedication and contributions to the ecosystem, each recipient received a challenge coin and certificate of achievement. The list of Gold awards winners can be found in Annex A.

Developed by Association of Information Security Professionals (AiSP) and Cyber Security Agency of Singapore (CSA), the SVRP is aimed at encouraging volunteerism amongst students while honing their interest and capabilities in cybersecurity. An initiative under CSA's SG Cyber Youth Programme supported by the SG Cyber Talent Development Fund, SVRP has received strong participation and support from local Institutes of Higher Learning (IHLs) as well as AiSP's industry partners. This year, a total of 235 nominations were received, a significant increase of 70% from 2021(133 nominations), reaching a new record.



AISP EXCO Member & SVRP Lead Ms Soffenny Yap shared "After 2 years, we are glad to be able to gather all the winners and have their peers, parents and lecturers witness their achievements. SVRP has been successful in encouraging volunteerism among youths and developing their interest in cybersecurity. The number of nominees has greatly increased compared to previous years as youths start to be



more aware of the importance of cybersecurity. AiSP has been actively engaging youths through SVRP and learning journeys to companies working closely with our partners to inspire youths and explore their potential in cybersecurity. We are pleased to share that this year, we have launched the overseas learning journey to KL from 12 Dec 22 to 15 Dec 22 in partnership with National Youth Council to bring Youths abroad to learn more about the culture and working environment overseas for them to better appreciate our local ecosystem in Singapore. Youths will be exposed to other working culture and enhance their knowledge on overseas companies and also the government body. We hope that it has been a rewarding journey for our awardees and their contributions serve as an inspiration for others."
